
With the third period, we had a History lesson. We talked about which historical things from Holland and Poland are the same, watched a short movie and then just talked with the teacher.


Our fourth period was a Geography lesson. In this lesson we did some photo assignments.

From 4.00 till 5.30 we had some shopping time. With a little group we went to some shops. We showed the Polish students the bookstore and a few



clothing stores. Which I thought was a great thing. And they liked it too. Then you had time to go home and eat because in the evening we would go to the observatory to look at stars. But because I live really far away, Nino, Oscar, Jitse, me and all our exchange students ate in the city and then just chilled in the park for two hours. It was a little boring.

The observatory was nice. Mister Wielinga guided us in the building and gave a short presentation. At 10 PM we could go home. It was really cold on the bike! At 11 PM I came home. Kaja and me both went to sleep quite quickly.
